Meeting Notes

Meeting notes elevate points made by presenters, Subcommittee Members, and public commenters during the Data Exchange Framework (DxF) Data Sharing Agreement (DSA) Policies and Procedures (P&Ps) Subcommittee meeting. Notes may be revised to reflect public comment received in advance of the next DSA P&P Subcommittee meeting. Welcome and Roll Call

Courtney Hansen, Assistant Chief Counsel, CalHHS CDII, welcomed attendees to the fourth meeting of the DSA P&P Subcommittee. Courtney reviewed the meeting agenda and introduced Subcommittee Members via roll call.

Vision and Meeting Objectives

Courtney Hansen reviewed the vision for data exchange in California as well as the meeting objectives.

Courtney reminded attendees of the deadline for mandatory signatories to sign the DSA on January 31, 2023, and directed prospective signatories to the <u>DSA Signing Portal</u> and the <u>CalHHS DxF website</u> for more information.





Policies and Procedures Development: Status and Next Steps

Courtney Hansen provided an overview of draft P&Ps in development.

Draft P&Ps recently released for public comment comprised:

- California Information Blocking Prohibitions
- Technical Requirements for Exchange
- Early Exchange
- Real-Time Data Exchange
- Privacy Standards and Security Safeguards (amended version of a previously finalized P&P)

Draft P&Ps in development comprised:

- Qualified Health Information Organization (QHIO) Program
- Monitoring and Auditing

P&Ps noted for potential future development comprised:

- Dispute Resolution
- Voluntary Signatories
- Data Quality
- Participant Registry

Comments from Subcommittee Members included:

- Recommendations to develop P&Ps addressing the following topics:
 - Accountability and enforcement
 - Consent management
- Support for development of P&Ps addressing the following topics:
 - Dispute resolution
 - o Data quality
- Recommendations that the Dispute Resolution P&P include policies to encourage informal collaboration and resolution of disagreements prior to their elevation to a formal dispute resolution and governance process.
 - Recommendation to leverage existing <u>Carequality framework for dispute</u> resolution.
 - Recommendation that there be a process for all DxF participants to learn from resolution of disagreements, including those that do not get escalated to the formal dispute resolution process.
- Recommendation that the DxF Participant Registry and its corresponding P&P allows the reporting of multiple networks/mechanisms that each participant uses to exchange data.
- Acknowledgement of the challenge of setting data quality expectations under the DxF given few existing standards
- Acknowledgement of the need to align participant data quality expectations with the DxF's approach for monitoring and auditing.





Overview of P&Ps Released for Comment

Courtney Hansen noted that CDII is soliciting public comments on drafts of four new P&Ps and one amended P&P through February 14, 2023. Presenters reviewed each P&P, highlighting revisions that have been made since the P&Ps were last discussed with the DSA P&P Subcommittee in December.

California Information Blocking Prohibitions

Courtney Hansen provided an overview of the P&P and reviewed recent updates.

Technical Requirements for Exchange

Rim Cothren, Independent HIE Consultant, CDII, provided an overview of the P&P and reviewed recent updates.

Comments from Subcommittee Members included:

- Diverging opinions on the proposed requirement that hospitals send all admission, discharge, and transfer (ADT) notifications to at least one QHIO
 - Those in support of the requirement noted that such a requirement may:
 - Help to ensure that any DxF participant who would like to receive relevant notifications can do so
 - Allow QHIOs to serve as a 'digital safety net' to support connectivity across the state
 - Those opposed to the requirement noted that such a requirement may:
 - Operationally and financially burden hospitals and is a significant expansion of hospitals' existing responsibilities to send ADT notifications
 - Inappropriately center the role of the QHIO in mediating data exchange in California
 - Be inconsistent with the 'technologically agnostic' language noted in the DxF's authorizing statute
- Importance of establishing best practices for use of the broadcast query exchange pattern to minimize overuse and burden on participants responding to such queries.
- Recommendation to clarify in public documentation whether QHIOs will be required to sign the DxF DSA.

Privacy Standards and Security Safeguards (amended)

Helen Pfister, Partner, Manatt Health Strategies, provided an overview of the amended P&P.

Comments from Subcommittee Members included:

• Recommendation for a more explicit definition of the term "securely destroy".

Real-Time Data Exchange





Cindy Bero, Senior Advisor, Manatt Health Strategies, provided an overview of the P&P and reviewed recent updates.

Comments from Subcommittee Members included:

 Diverging opinions on whether 'real-time' should be defined using conceptual language like 'without delay' or using explicit time ranges (e.g., seconds or minutes)

Early Exchange

Helen Pfister provided an overview of the P&P and reviewed recent updates.

Courtney Hansen reminded attendees that public comment would be accepted through February 14, 2023, and directed prospective commenters to the <u>CalHHS DxF website</u> for more information.

Draft Language for P&P in Development

Helen Pfister reviewed draft language for the QHIO Program P&P. Helen Pfister noted that the P&P supports establishment of the QHIO Program and that additional detail on the Program will be described in forthcoming guidance. Courtney Hansen noted that a QHIO Townhall will be scheduled for February 2023 to solicit additional stakeholder feedback on the QHIO Program.

Comments from Subcommittee Members included:

- Recognition that various aspects of the QHIO Program (e.g., QHIO designation and expectations) are still under development.
- Recommendation that the QHIO Program P&P be finalized at the same time as, or following, finalization of other QHIO Program guidance.
- Recommendation to clarify whether technology vendors can be QHIOs
- Recommendation that CDII consider an approach in which HIOs with various levels of readiness can apply to be a QHIO, as long as they are transparent to the market about what specific capabilities and DxF requirements they can support.

Public Comment

Courtney Hansen opened the meeting to public comment, which included¹:
