CDII cannot advise entiities as to which category their organization may fit. Organizations that are identified in California Health and Safety Code (HSC) § 130290(f) as required to sign the DSA will be given preference in the first two rounds of funding. If you have determined that your organization is required by HSC § 130290(f) to sign the DSA by Jan 31, 2023, then your application will be considered in any round of funding, for either grant domain (QHIO Onboarding or TA). If you have determined that organization is a voluntary signatory you would be eligible for to apply for funding in round 3.

6.	Anna Zimbrick	I believe the answer is "yes", but can you please clarify if for an umbrella application, does the organization applying on behalf of signatories also have to sign the DSA?	Hi Anna, thanks for your question! You are correct - an applicant applying on behalf of signatories does not need to have signed the DSA themselves. However, all entities they are applying on behalf of must be DSA signatories.
7.	Magean Whaley	So, if you're already signed up with a company who is helping you with data exchange due to the requirements of the MIPS program, but you're not sure if they meet the requirements of the QHIO you mentioned how do we proceed? If we don't know if we need to switch companies, how can we know if we qualify for the grant?	We have two domains, QHIO Onboarding and TA, to provide options for different situations. If you are already signed up with a company but not yet able to exchange per the DxF, I suggest you review the TA domain. You may see options under that domain that would help you achieve DxF readiness without having to make a switch.
8.	Sean Kirkpatrick	Is that a catch-22 for non-required signatories, ensuring they do not qualify for the grant funding? They cannot sign until they already meet the requirements, so cannot apply for the grant assistance.	live answered
9.	Rashed Behroz	Is transitioning from one EHR to another EHR that has capability of data sharing can be considered eligible for applying for TA Grant?	Potentially, yes. See the Application Guidance for more detail, but transitioning EHR solutions is potentially in the scope of TA Grants if it allows for the achievement of DSA requirements.

12.	Warren Northern	For an FQHC with several clinic locations, would that be one signatory or one signatory per clinic?	it depends on how your organization signed the DSA. Some signed as Parent Org only, and therefore 1 Signatory. Some signed as Parent and listed different locations as Subordinate entities.

14.	Will Panza	Are local health jurisdictions eligible to apply for the grant?	Hi Will, thanks for your question! As long as the local health jurisdication has signed the DSA and meets the eligiblity criteria (page 12 of the Grants Guidance Document), they would be eligible to apply for the grant.
15.	Ken Riomales	Is the enhanced funding in addition to the baseline amounts, or are the amounts listed on the guide the maximums (included enhanced funding)?	Hi Ken, thanks for your question! The enhanced funding is not in addition to the baseline funding. Signatories are *either* eligible for baseline funding or enhanced funding (if they meet the detailed critiera). You can find more details on page 20 and 21 of the guidance document.
16.	Jatinder Singh	Do we need to use QHIO for HIE?	No, QHIO are not required. See the Application





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			Guidance for more detail on Technical Assistance domain grants, and details on what qualifies for those.
17.	Anna Zimbrick	Can you please clarify what is meant by TA Grant milestone 1: "Grantee procures resources that account for at least 50% of grant budget within one year of grant award"? Does "procure resources" mean identify/contract for TA that costs equal to at least 50% of the grant budget? or does this refer to securing additional financial resources? Thanks	Hi Anna, thanks for your question! To clarify this language, you're correct in your first interpretation. "Procure resources" means identifying/contracting for that TA, and does not refer to securing additional financial resources. You can find more information on page 32 and 33 of the Guidance Document.
18.	Jennifer Westhoff	Is there any way to talk to someone to verify if we are meeting all the requirements of the agreement without applying for a grant? Or is there a technical assistant consultant we can talk to prior to?	Hi Jennifer, Thank you for your question! We recommend reaching out to the DxF Educational Grantees for help in understanding DSA requirements. 22.	Felix Su	For the FQHC system with multiple locations example, isn't the size the application driven by the number of instances? (So if the 15 FQHC sites had 3 separate EHR instances, those instances would determine the total max funding amount in the umbrella application, correct?)	Hi Felix, Yes, the number of EHR instances used by the signatories in an application is a factor in the amount of funding that an application can receive. Other factors include the characteristics of those signatories.
23.	James Hetherington	Can you share a sense of what % a QHIO onboarding grant would cover in costs associated with implementation? I understand there would be ongoing costs which would be the Participant's responsibility.	CDII does not have information on costs. The DSA Signatory Grants Program has been designed to supplement costs, as opposed to covering all costs.
24.	Kecia Friesen	We are a skilled Nursing Facility that have ExperienceCare for our electronic medical records. How do I find out if our system is set up to work with the DxF?	Hi Kecia, Thank you for your question! We recommend reaching out to one of the DxF Educational Grantees for help in understanding DSA requirements. 25.	Ken Riomales	Is CalHOP the only criteria of exclusion for either grant types? In other words, if the organization has received CalHOP funding, they are excluded. Are there any other programs that exclude organizations (i.e. Meaningful Use, BHQIP, etc.)	Hi Ken, thanks for your question! CalHOP is one of the criteria to determine whether the signatory is eligble for Enhanced Funding. CalHOP does not preclude an organization from being eligble for grant funding entirely. If an organization has recieved CalHOP funding, they would still be eligble for Baseline Funding. There are no other past funding programs that





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			would exclude organizations from applying for funding.
26.	Susy Cabrera	Entities that are considered as Business Associate under HIPAA that provide only Care Management Services to health plans, do they need to apply?	Hi Susy, Thank you for raising this question. If you can submit this question to cdii@chhs.ca.gov, the DxF team can take this question and get back to you via email.

Barbara Hanna	most home health agencies must have EHR, due to reporting requirements for OASIS transmission similar to MSDS for SNF. it appears that Home care and hospice is always left out of funding opportunities, yet we are the location of where most patients end up living after post hospitlalization and or ER visits. i would love to assist in looking at the need for funding opportunities for home health care agencies that need this type of funding.,	Hi Barbara, Thank you for raising this question about home health and hospice. Rashed Behroz	Based on DXF a samll medical group with less than 25 physicians is not required to share data until Jan 31, 2026! if you are not required to share data until then	Yes, required signatories who have until Jan 31, 2026 to begin exchange are eligible to apply in any of the three rounds.

32.	Felix Su	Please clarify what is meant by "batch review" of applications. Will CDII not begin reviewing any Round 1 submissions until after June 16 (when the round closes)?	CDII and PCG will review all applications submitted in Round 1 before making and announcing funding decisions on applications submitted in that round (or "batch").

Sean Kirkpatrick	As an ECM provider, we are being required by the Managed Care Plan to participate in DxF even though we are otherwise a non- required signatory as we fall into the voluntary category. Does this mean we do not get support/funding for onboarding? This is a pretty big barrier to offering ECM services through a local health department.	Thank you for raising this question. ECM providers who do not fall under the six categories for the initial DSA Signatory Grant rounds may be eligible to apply for a DSA Signatory Grant starting in July (in Round 3). ECM providers also may consider funding opportunities provided by DHCS (such as PATH CITED) or through their MCP (such as IPP); here is an overview of those opportunities: https://www.dhcs.ca.gov/Do cuments/MCQMD/Funding- Opportunities-Cheat- Sheet.pdf

Denise DiNoto	My understanding is if you are already connected to an HIO that meets the DSA requirements and/or is/becomes a QHIO then you are not eligible for the QHIO onboarding grant - am I understanding that correctly?	This is correct if your QHIO configuration already enables you to complete data exchange in accordance with the DxF.
