So my department Cdi. Has contracted with public consulting group, also known as Pcg.

To be the third-party grant, administrator.

[DeeAnne McCallin] 10:12:45
You may hear me say, or other, or see it in writing Tpa for third party administrator for the signatory grant.

[DeeAnne McCallin] 10:12:52
They're working closely with Pete Cdi, and of course our colleagues on the Manette team, who are Cdis trusted advisors for the data exchange framework.

But Pcg. And Cdi will be reviewing applications, and they will recommend applications for approval to Cdi.

[DeeAnne McCallin] 10:13:11
They do service. The fiscal administrator, so funds will flow through Pcg.

[DeeAnne McCallin] 10:13:17
To the Grant recipients applicants that are approved become grantees.

[DeeAnne McCallin] 10:13:22
They'll troubleshoot any issue with the application portal as they arrive and collect and review progress reports which are needed to help with the fiscal part and report on best practices and the disbursement of funds.

And also with us is Kai, the California Health Information California Association of Health Information Exchanges.

They're contracted and partnered with. Cdi to provide grant applications, support to the applicants, so that last October 2022 we held listening sessions and a lot of the feedback with that folks just do not have the bandwidth or the time to

do to apply for grant. So this has been stood up in this part of the domain to help assist applicants.

And the high will provide end-to-end application, support, and submissions for the Qhio onboarding grant application.

Khei is here with us today as well as Pcd. And you'll hear from both groups during those 2 h Kaye will review an applicant's friend eligibility and funding qualifications, and we'll work with you the applicants on drafting and submitting

the application. So a lot of today will be actually going show talking about the Grants portal for the technical assistance grant.

But you it's really meaningful for folks who want to apply for the Qhio onboarding Grant, and if you don't know what these 2 are, don't worry.

We're going to cover that today. Good! You should pay attention when we're talking about the technical assistance grants.

Even if you're leaning towards the Qhio onboarding brand, because the application platform is is the same or very similar. Alrighty.

It'll be a long 2 h. So I wanted to share a little bit of background about the Grant program.

□ 10:15:41

I saw a good number of folks today are hearing about the program for the first time, so we'll spend a little bit of time here, but I will also flag for every one participating today that Cdi did a really comprehensive overview of the grant opportunity the eligibility criteria

□ 10:15:59

and the parameters in April. So we'll go ahead and drop a link to that in the chat for anyone who may also want to review that as well. If if you're learning about the program for the first.

□ 10:16:11

So the data exchange Grant program is intended to support implementation of the data exchange framework.

□ 10:16:17

Cdi is going to administer 50 million dollars in funding over 2 years with 3 really really critical goals.

□ 10:16:25

Here the first is supporting data exchange framework implementation among signatories and under-resource geographies and or signatory serving historically marginalized populations and underserved communities.

□ 10:16:38

And we'll talk as we get throughout the presentation today.

□ 10:16:40

A little bit how that applies throughout the criteria, and you'll see that in the application as well.

□ 10:16:46

Second major goal is to address significant barriers to data, exchange framework implementation.

□ 10:16:53

Be them operational, technical, or other, for signatories of the data exchange framework.

□ 10:16:59

And then the third is to ensure that this program is clearly aligned with other grant programs available to help in human and social services providers and to promote activities that are ineligible for funding by other grant programs.

□ 10:17:17

So with those major goals in mind, I will share a little bit specifically about the Dsa signatory grant.

□ 10:17:26

So dsa. Signatory grants are a subset of the broader dxf.

□ 10:17:30

Grant program last year Cdi launched the Excess Educational Grant initiative to promote education and outreach of the data exchange framework.

□ 10:17:38

Today, we're going to be focused specifically on the Dsa signatory grants which are designed to provide direct support to signatories.

□ 10:17:45

To subsidize their implementation efforts. This grant fund, this grant is going to fund activities for signatories to meet their Dsa requirements.

□ 10:17:54

And we're going to talk about what that looks like some detail today.

□ 10:17:58

I will note before we dive into all of the components of the Grant programs that we have a very detailed grant guidance document available on the Cdi website that is really designed to answer every question we could think of about the Dsa signatory Grant program.

□ 10:18:15

We're going to refer you to this document throughout the presentation today, and it's going to really help you as an applicant, especially once the conversation is over today. If you had questions, if you're kind of working out what you're eligible for what you want to apply for that document.

□ 10:18:30

is going to be a really key result.

□ 10:18:33

And so with that, let's dive into some core elements of the program.

□ 10:18:37

So first question first, when will appliance be accepted? This might be the most common question that we do up to 47 million dollars will be allocated to apple prints across at least 3 rounds of funding.

□ 10:18:53

So Cdi is holding multiple rounds in order to really balance the fact that there are signatories who have a 2,024 deadline and Cdr.

□ 10:19:01

Wants to acknowledge and support those signatories in achieving that deadline and begin so that they can begin exchanging data.

□ 10:19:09

But at the same time Cdi does want to ensure that organizations with limited resources have sufficient time to complete and submit an application.

□ 10:19:16

With that in mind, Cdi intends to hold multiple rounds so what you'll see here is, there are 2 short rounds. Those are the initial rounds of the program, and those are open to certain signatories who may need to implement by 2024 so we'll tell you

□ 10:19:33

a little bit more about who those are. On the next slide, but these rounds are really designed to help Cdi get funding to signatories who have a short timeline for implementation to implement as quickly as possible and to support them in getting that funding as quickly as possible starting in

□ 10:19:50

July, cider, I will open around to a broader session of eligible applicants, including voluntary signatories of the Dsa.

□ 10:19:57

And what? We'll look at that shortly, and then I'll just note that there may be additional funding rounds beyond the first 3, depending on application volumes and scoring in those first 3 rounds.

□ 10:20:07

So let's look at who is eligible? Who qualifies for a Dsa signatory grant.

□ 10:20:12

So the following criteria applied to both the Grant domains, which we'll talk about in a moment and at a high level.

□ 10:20:18

The 2 most essential criteria, eligibility, criteria for a Dsa.

□ 10:20:24

Signatory grant is that one. The organization must be a signatory of the Dsa.

□ 10:20:30

And 2. The organization must have a must require technical support and capabilities.

□ 10:20:38

To help them in achieving their Dsa requirements.

□ 10:20:42

So organizations that are already 100% of the way there and don't need additional support would not be eligible.

□ 10:20:46

But a signatory that can demonstrate that they have these to achieve their Dsa requirement is eligible for the Grant program.

□ 10:20:54

What you'll see on the bottom. Here is a delineation of who's eligible by round.

□ 10:21:00

So for the short expedited rounds that round one and round 2.

□ 10:21:04

That start this month. Cdi is limiting applications to a subset of organizations.

□ 10:21:10

In order to really help organizations achieve their debt, their dxf debt.

□ 10:21:17

And so signatories in the applications for the first 2 rounds of Dsa signatory grants are limited to specific organization types that are listed here they are general acute care hospitals, physician organizations and medical groups skills, nursing facilities, healthcare service

□ 10:21:34

plans, and disability insurers clinical laboratories, and acute psychiatric hospitals.

□ 10:21:37

What else? Starting in round 3, the Grant opportunity will open to most signatories who demonstrate a health it need, including voluntary signatories, and we encourage folks to take a look at that grant guidance.

□ 10:21:53

So just a double click on that first eligibility criteria, in order to be eligible for this grant, you do have to have signed the data, exchange the Dsa.

□ 10:22:03

The the data sharing agreement on this slide.

□ 10:22:07

We give you a little bit of highlight on how to do that?

□ 10:22:10

We're gonna drop a link to the Dsa.

□ 10:22:14

Signing portal for folks in the chat and if you have not yet signed the Dsa.

□ 10:22:18

And you are interested in a Dsa signatory grant.

□ 10:22:22

Please be sure to do so. We'll also make available the link of signatories who have already signed.

□ 10:22:28

If you are not sure of your.

□ 10:22:31

So who can actually submit the grant application, and this is a question that we get a lot.

□ 10:22:37

We've just talked about the fact that organizations who signed the Dsa are eligible for grant funding the organization that actually clicks submit on the application, so to speak, can be either the eligible signatory applying on their own behalf or the eligible

□ 10:22:55

signatory can essentially select another organization. Who's gonna apply on their behalf.

□ 10:23:00

And so what that would look like is an organization that is applying on behalf of one or multiple eligible signatories.

□ 10:23:06

This is often referred to as an umbrella applicants, and this allows for scenarios such as, for example, a corporate parent, an independent practice association, or other, to apply on behalf of multiple organizations who have signed the data the really key piece here though is that all signatories

□ 10:23:26

included in an application, must co-sign me.

□ 10:23:30

So we've spoken a couple times about the domains or the Grant opportunities.

□ 10:23:35

There are 2 different opportunities for applicants who are looking for Dsa signatory grant funding the first.

□ 10:23:43

Is Qaio. On boarding Grant, and the second is the technical assistance grant.

□ 10:23:48

I'm going to take each of these one by one and explain them briefly.

□ 10:23:52

The Qa. So onboarding grant is what we often refer to as the assisted pathway.

□ 10:23:58

Dean noted earlier in today's Town Hall that we did a series of listening sessions in October to understand what signatories would need in order to be able to implement the Dxf.

□ 10:24:12

And get the funding and support that they need to do that one of the core things that really came through in those sessions is the major challenge in navigating the process of applying and then managing a grant project.

□ 10:24:23

So with this assisted pathway, Cdi is really supporting applicants by providing them support in a number of different ways.

□ 10:24:34

The first core piece to know here is that in order to receive full funding for the Qh.

□ 10:24:40

Tao onboarding Grant and the core purpose of a Qa.

□ 10:24:43

Onboarding Grant is to complete onboarding to a qualified health information organization for folks that aren't familiar with the Qh.

□ 10:24:53

L. A Qhio is a health information organization that has been qualified by Cdi, based on its ability to meet Dxf data exchange requirements.

□ 10:25:00

Cdi will be announcing a list of qhos later this week.

□ 10:25:06

So what does it look like for an applicant here Cdi, as I noted it's gonna publish that list of Qaios and those q I shows are going to be able to help applicants identify the technical and operational solutions to complete Qh I/O onboarding and begin to

□ 10:25:21

exchange data in real time. In accordance with the data marketing.

□ 10:25:25

Pay high, which Deanne already spoke to earlier today will work with applicants and submit app applications on their behalf.

□ 10:25:35

So this really gets to that assisted element of the work.

□ 10:25:37

Kay High is going to be supporting applicants end to end with that application process, and they're going to talk about that a little bit later.

□ 10:25:45

And finally, once an organization if they are awarded a grant, the process for submitting grant reports and managing the funding will actually be done with support from the Qhio.

□ 10:25:58

So this is really an assisted pathway. Start to finish a technical assistance.

□ 10:26:02

Grant is more of a build, your own pathway solution in order to receive full funding in this domain, a grantee would need to achieve one of the 4 following outcomes.

□ 10:26:14

They would either have to identify and contract with a technology solution 2, they could implement a technology solution capable of supporting real-time data exchange 3, they

have to have adjusted upgraded or adopted an electronic documentation system and 4 or 4 desktop created and provided training for

□ 10:26:34

new workflows. And all of these requirements are included in much more detail in the Grant Guidance dot payment for any questions you may have about what is contained within those apps.

□ 10:26:44

For this domain applicants will be responsible for identifying the technical and operational solutions that they want to pursue that will be responsible for completing and submitting their application.

□ 10:26:56

And then, if awarded, they will be responsible for receiving and managing the Grant fund.

□ 10:27:00

So this is really the build, your own pathway solution, where you, as an applicant, are sort of deciding the whole process, and to finish.

□ 10:27:11

How can signatories use funding? So here we've listed out the permissible and impermissible uses of funding in each grant domain?

□ 10:27:20

I'm not going to speak to every element listed on this block, and each element here is detailed in much more, with much more information in the Grant guidance document.

□ 10:27:29

But what I will. Highlight is the high-level principle behind funding for each of the domains on the Qhio onboarding side, if awarded the Qh. I/O. Onboarding grant application now grantee will work with their selected qhio to determine how funds will be used to

□ 10:27:46

complete onboarding the Qhio, and the grantee will only receive the full funding.

□ 10:27:51

If qhio onboarding is completed, so they will work together to determine the best way to use grant funding to do that.

□ 10:27:58

That's the core principle for funding there and that I encourage you to read the permissible and implementable uses below that for Ta.

□ 10:28:05

Grant, PA. Applicants must demonstrate how proposed funding will help them meet their Dsa.

□ 10:28:11

Requirements. This is a fundamental underpinning of that domain.

□ 10:28:14

Any proposed activities in that domain must be part of an organization pathway to achieving the their Dsa requirements and conducting data exchange in accordance with the.

□ 10:28:29

How much can funding can signatories request? So this is a question that we get a lot to help signatories with this in their application.

□ 10:28:39

Cdi has published the process for determining the maximum grant, funding that a signatory can request.

□ 10:28:45

As you can see here, one of the primary determinants of the amount of funding that a signatory can request is the type of signatory that they are.

□ 10:28:54

So here we've listed the baseline funding maximum for each of the core signatory types as they apply for the Grant program, a couple highlights here, signatories meeting certain criteria may be eligible for more funding referred to as enhanced

□ 10:29:10

funding these criteria really are intended to identify and support organizations that are working in underserved areas and supporting underserved and historically marginalized communities.

□ 10:29:21

And I encourage you to refer to the Grant Guidance document for more information.

□ 10:29:23

There one other note we've spoken about the fact that an applicant can include a lot of this.

□ 10:29:32

Many many different signatories. So if you are an umbrella applicant applying on behalf of multiple signatories, the Grant guidance document have kind of the detailed

breakdown of how to calculate how much funding you could request and that is the determinant of each of

□ 10:29:46

for exchange, certain entity types are called out in the regulation for an additional 2 years for readiness.

Once you have that you can have your account information saved for up to 30 days.

So that you don't need to reverify your account each time you enter the portal from the device that you have verified your account on.

So if you verify your account on the PC. That you do your work from that device will allow you to log into grants, connect, using only your your password and the login information. From that point forward, however, other devices may require you to verify your account again.

Every application will have a unique application number. If you ever have questions, or anything that you need to contact us about in reference to a specific application, please be sure to use that application number along with it, so that we can identify correctly which application we're talking about which application we're providing support on that's a very

important. And that is what we're gonna use to organize these applications when we're looking at them and thinking about them, because we hope to get as many as possible.

Many of you will want to or need to add contributors to your application.

[Mark Noyes] 10:59:35

As you go on. This could be additional people who can provide different types of information to the grant could be additional contributors who you want to review information in the grant.

It could be somebody at K-he, adding you so that you can review and do the final submission of application in order to do this once you are logged in and inside your application.

[Mark Noyes] 10:59:56

You click on the manage applicants. There's that little person plus button right at the right on the application, and you can add an additional Us. Account.

[Mark Noyes] 11:00:12

That's very important. They must have their own grants, connect account in order to be added as a contributor or reviewer on your application, and you must have a grants connect account to be added on their application, so make sure that everybody at your organization who you may want to have a review or input.

[Mark Noyes] 11:00:33

Into your application, has an account, and can be added onto your application unless you take that step they won't be able to see any of the information.

[Mark Noyes] 11:00:45

So be sure that everybody who needs to have access to the application gets an account.

[Mark Noyes] 11:00:53

At the top of the application you will see different tabs that will provide you spaces to enter different information, to help you keep track of and keep organized with what information is required of you.

[Mark Noyes] 11:01:06

What information needs to be entered in at every step. You can also, at the bottom of every page, use a next and previous button to navigate between them, using the tab at the top.

[Mark Noyes] 11:01:19

Allows you to skip entire sections. If you want to answer questions asynchronously or provide different details, come back at a later time in order to complete your application.

[Mark Noyes] 11:01:32

Which you can do because grants connect will automatically save as you are.

[Mark Noyes] 11:01:39

Application goes along. There's a at the bottom left, a saved icon.

[Mark Noyes] 11:01:42

You can also use that in order to manually save an application before you log out, however, the platform will auto.

Save for you every few seconds. Nope, that does sometimes cause some delays in the grants connect system.

[Mark Noyes] 11:02:01

So sometimes you just need to give it a second. Be kind to it, and allow it to save.

It's really, it's for everyone's benefit.

[Mark Noyes] 11:02:12

We didn't wanna take a second to go into specifically one page of the application proposed activities for the funding request.

For ta grants. All applicants will need to fill out the sorts of resources they are going to be up using Grant funds to acquire a description of those resources and the amount of grant funding that they are requesting for that resource, the types of allowable resources are covered in the application

guidance document that was posted in the chat earlier.

[Mark Noyes] 11:02:54

It's really funny information. I really suggest you read it.

[Mark Noyes] 11:02:59

The resource description is open text, and allows you to provide us with a more detailed idea of what precisely those funds are going to be used for, and the budget request is just that it is the amount of funds that are going to be spent on that resource at

[Mark Noyes] 11:03:15

the bottom of this list, it will total the entire grant. Request that your that your signatory is making, that your colleague entities are making in that application.

[Mark Noyes] 11:03:30

So be aware of the funding request caps and the enhanced funding caps again presented inside that application, guidance document so that you can make sure to align your budget.

[Mark Noyes] 11:03:45

Request with what is allowable under the program. Now there are many, many different ways that could be assembled there are many ways that that could look, and the only thing that I can tell you.

When you ask, how much is our organization qualified for is to refer to the guidance document and figure it out, using the information presented there.

There will be points where you will be to upload attachments, or where we might request attachments and documentation from you.

After the application. In order to do this, you will see a pretty familiar, I believe, to most people upload a document, request box.

When you sign in for the first time, you're going to see a pop-up box in the center of your screen that's going to allow you to start a new application.

So it brings me to a list of all my applications, and, as mentioned earlier, if you have multiple applications in status, whether those are in draft status or in progress, then you can see them here along the list, you can also see your application Id in the bottom left corner of each application so if you reach out to

us, for support. You can reference that specific application. It tells you.

When this was created, you do have the ability here to manage those you can delete or cancel an application if you created one, an error, or you want to start over for some reason on an application and we would ask that you delete the application or cancel an application that you are not going

to go ahead and submit. So just for ease.

[Jessica Decker] 11:08:38

And so I'm gonna click into the application here.

[Jessica Decker] 11:08:46

And sometimes it takes just a second to load their. You'll see that, don't let that concern you if you see it.

Just spending a little bit there. It's just taking a little bit of time to load.

[Jessica Decker] 11:08:56

And so this is my applicant screen here, and we've talked about some of the features and functions here as Mark mentioned, it will continuously save in that left-hand corner.

If you want to log out, you can just go here and click log out over in this corner, and it will lock you out, and when it does that it will save your application.

[Jessica Decker] 11:09:15

But if you are accidentally, you say you haven't Internet disruption, it is going to go ahead and save a majority of your application.

[Jessica Decker] 11:09:22

It saves every few seconds. It's possible you could lose a question, but it does pretty well do a good job of making sure.

[Jessica Decker] 11:09:29

It saves all of your information. Okay? And so this is my application that I've gone ahead and started.

We can see it here. We can download an application in in the right corner.

[Jessica Decker] 11:09:41

Here you can see that if you would like to do that initially, some people like to go in download that blank application so they can start gathering all of the different pieces that they need other people want to just jump in and start working in the portal and either way.

Is certainly fine with us, and so on. The first page you will see some information about the Dsa.

[Jessica Decker] 11:09:59

Things that we have covered a lot today you'll see a link to the Grant guidance document.

[Jessica Decker] 11:10:05

We've talked about that that's there in the portal for you to click into and it talks about when you should complete this application so if you are applying as a ta grant.

[Jessica Decker] 11:10:15

Wonderful if you need to reach out to Kai. It's 20 to give their email right here.

[Jessica Decker] 11:10:21

And you can just click on that, and it will pull up an email and you can email, Kai to start working with them.

[Jessica Decker] 11:10:26

If you need further support from Pcg. We have the link here, or the 1 1 800 number that you can contact us for support.

[Jessica Decker] 11:10:34

Whatever your preferences. And again, another link to that guidance document, because we strongly recommend that you review it.

[Jessica Decker] 11:10:41

So this is our first page of our application. There's not any thing to complete on this page.

[Jessica Decker] 11:10:46

You can click at the bottom. Here, right hand corner next to go to the next screen, or what I like to do is to go to the top here and click through my tabs.

[Jessica Decker] 11:10:55

It just kind of keeps me on track and aware of which tab I'm in.

[Jessica Decker] 11:10:59

But please feel free to use either option. Just know that you don't want to click that sign and submit, and won't be able to click that sign and submit until all of your different required questions are complete.

So I have already selected that I'm applying for the Ta.

[Jessica Decker] 11:11:16

Grant I fill in my organization name, telephone number, contact person and email and title there and then the very next thing I'm going to select is how many signatories will be included in my application.

We have up to 10 signatories here. If you need to provide information for more than 10 signatories, we're gonna ask that you reach out to us and we're gonna provide.

You with a document to do that, instead of going through the portal.

It's just a lot of information together in the portal for more than 10 signatories.

[Jessica Decker] 11:11:47

But if you are completing for less than 10 signatories, you can do that right here in the portal.

And so we are going to just submit for one today, just for simplicity we're going to go through what it's like to submit for a single signatory.

And so I've completed this page, and I can move on to my next page, which is my signatory character in.

And so I'm going to fill out this information here about the name.

The signatory type, which is a dropdown. It gives your signatory types here.

If I and then I'm going to go through and select the different things from that on behalf of the organization who signed this Dsa signatory.

So I wanna make sure I have that information. The individual who's signed the signatory, the current capacity, whether we have capacity to already complete data exchange.

The population is served by the signatory, and so these are some just different dropdown questions.

Here, you want to complete. Have that information on hand. We had the full street address, and we also asked for the Zip code, and that is a way for us just to help with tracking of these applications.

And so, if you are a primary signatory using the Ehr, then you're going to answer a few questions here, just yes or no questions about that.

About what your ehr capacity is, and whether you're already conducting some real-time exchange of information. There.

So you're gonna fill out those and you're gonna fill out these sections for each signatory again, I just selected one.

But you can fill out up to 10 on here, and so if you, though, are like me, and you just select one, you're going to go to these next screens and you're just gonna see that these pages are blank, and you're going to continue on.

Request one, I entered a thousand of budget request to, and you can see that already it goes ahead and populates the total funding request. There.

So there's up to 10 fields you can enter here, and each one of these will populate this information for you.

It's just going to calculate the total funding request there. So there's up to 10 fields you can enter here, and each one of these will populate this information.

Okay, on our next page, we're going to talk about Dsa funding requirements.

And so we're just gonna explain some different things about using information.

Those are 200 word maximum. So it, you know, if you paragraphs there, you can't submit a full page of information, but also that will give you some opportunity to answer that question fully.

Remember I said we weren't going to answer that question, so we were going to see what's happening there, and why that box is popping up.

said, this input that says, this input is required. And so you want to click one of those, and that answers our question.

It takes away all of our red boxes there in our exclamation points, so that tells us we're okay to move forward, move back to the Dsa requirements.

And I have the same thing. I have a box here. With my exclamation mark, and that this input is required.

So I'm going to enter something there so that I can move forward.

And then we're gonna move to our attestations and certifications.

This was mentioned, as well, but we do have each signatory sign.

[Jessica Decker] 11:19:13

A signatory attestation form. You can click and download this form here, and then you can upload it into this box.

[Jessica Decker] 11:19:21

If you have more than 10 signatories, then you may have to combine files because this box allows for 10 uploads.

[Jessica Decker] 11:19:31

So it's just something to be aware of. And so now look at the bottom line. I'm on my last page, and I have my sign and submit.

[Jessica Decker] 11:19:40

When I do that it pops up here and allows me just to.

[Jessica Decker] 11:19:47

Write my name, and it makes it pretty. There. You can even select your style if you want, and then you sign and submit that way.

[Jessica Decker] 11:20:00

And so you can see up here. It says, I've successfully submitted that application.

[Jessica Decker] 11:20:06

What's also going to happen? There is you're also going to receive an email and it may go to your junk mail or spam mail.

[Jessica Decker] 11:20:15

But you should receive, and you will receive an email that says that it is a confirmation that you're out.

[Jessica Decker] 11:20:22

After you submit your application, you will not be able to make edits to it.

[Jessica Decker] 11:20:27

So we wanna make sure that your application is complete before you actually submit.

[Jessica Decker] 11:20:32

It, because you cannot, without reaching out to Pcg.

[Jessica Decker] 11:20:36

And getting approval, to make an edit to your application.

[Jessica Decker] 11:20:39

You cannot make edits to applications that are submitted.

[Jessica Decker] 11:20:41

They are now in a review process, but certainly reach out to us if something happens, and you have erroneously submitted an application, and we will help you figure out what our next steps are.

From there we talked about this as well. You can also manage applicants by clicking on this in the right corner there, and you can search by entering an applicant's email.

Gives you the thumbs up. That means that you'll have to email us to ask for the ability to revise an application or be requested by us to go in and revise an application.

Once you have submitted as Jessica said, your point of contact in the application will receive an email confirmation about submittal and applications will be reviewed and evaluated by Pcg.

According to the criteria that was developed by Cdi, Pcg, we're gonna provide recommendations.

[Mark Noyes] 11:25:10

2 Cbi. For approval. Well, Cdi ultimately holds the final decision-making over approval and denial.

[Mark Noyes] 11:25:19

We simply offer them our recommendations. They have all of the information they have.

[Mark Noyes] 11:25:24

Our refundation, they have access to the grant, and we'll make final decisions on all approvals and announcements, applicants will be notified of that decision via an email.

[Mark Noyes] 11:25:35

Cdi. And Pcg. We expect to announce award determinations for the initial rounds within approximately 2 months of the close of the round.

[Mark Noyes] 11:25:45

This may be sooner, if we get fewer applications.

[Mark Noyes] 11:25:49

However, right now 2 months is what we predict. We will need to review, recommend, and make final decisions on all of those.

[Mark Noyes] 11:25:59

If your grant is awarded, you will need to complete Grant contracting with Tcg.

[Mark Noyes] 11:26:07

As it's a third-party administer in order to receive funds and begin work, we'll go into more detail about what that process contains and requires at a later date.

But just know that there will be a little bit more work to do on the grant, contracting side for those individuals who are awarded their grant applications.

If you would like to at anytime, you can check the status of your application by logging in to grants, connect, and to looking at the application in your branch, connect portal as Jessica showed us earlier.

There are several statuses here I'm not going to spend a bunch of time going over the specific meaning of each of these.

[Mark Noyes] 11:26:53

Just know that any of these could appear, and some might require some action from you, or may simply let you know that something is continuing. And it's in an ongoing process.

You may get revision request, in which case we will unlock your application and provide you with guidance on what needs to be revised in order for your application to be considered eligible, and be reviewed.

You can find this by logging into your application portal and view your applications.

You will see a revised form button pop up there.

[Mark Noyes] 11:27:39

If we have requ requested that you make a revision to your application, this could be for clarification to correct an error that we have seen.

There are a number of reasons we might ask you to revise your application, and I won't go into the full list of items that we have discussed that might require revision.

But there are a few, and doing so in grants. Connect.

It's fairly easy. It's just the process of opening up your application and altering the information.

That's been presented.

Your application will be evaluated, based on the characteristics of all signatories included on the grant, including the population they serve.

Their organizational need and their capacity for health information, exchange.

[Mark Noyes] 11:28:31

There will be a scoring based on the efficient use of funds.

[Mark Noyes] 11:28:34

The ability to meet Dsa requirements, using those funds as well as the ability of the organization to maintain Dsa requirements in the future.

[Mark Noyes] 11:28:46

For all of this is our questions detailed on the application that you will provide information through the application portal.

[Mark Noyes] 11:28:55

The application document that is available online has more information on absolutely all of these.

[Mark Noyes] 11:29:03

And the specific questions that we need in order to evaluate your application.

If you are accepted for a grant. You will need to submit quarterly progress reports detailing your movement toward the goals that you selected be the that qhio onboarding, or one of the team grant outcomes that Jessica pointed out in the grant application and are

fully detailed in the application, guidance. This will include any purchases made, some challenges that counter or any milestones that you have accomplished.

Both grant domains as Juliet pointed out earlier, have 2 milestones, each of writ which requires active taste.

App has station. Yeah, that you have met that milestone and the funds will be dispersed according to the information in the Grant agreement.

You'll have full edit privileges. It is, after all, your application.

The intent here is to gather information. Take out the drudge work, especially due narratives, although I know you're a great writer.

So not a problem for you, but others may not be so facile, and budget amounts, etc.

Will come initially from applicants, but of course, in the end the qhio is the one that will get the funds, and we'll sort through from the budget amounts in all likelihood.

Our applicants will want us to put them in for the maximum amount possible.

Thanks. Bob. Someone else is asked, can you apply for a technical assistance, Grant, while you are already working with a Qhio.

Well, you're probably already working with an Hio, but who subsequently becomes queued.

[Bob Jordan] 11:42:48

Yeah.

[DeeAnne McCallin] 11:42:48

You can, so we do not have a hard fast.

[DeeAnne McCallin] 11:42:51

No, but we do encourage that. You look into your eligibility, and whether you have, are already doing exchange.

[DeeAnne McCallin] 11:43:02

Oh! Which I thought of the bus that escaped me before one example, both, whether you are already working with perhaps a national network.

[DeeAnne McCallin] 11:43:12

Perhaps the California Health Information Exchange, maybe in your own regional medical neighborhood type of thing.

[DeeAnne McCallin] 11:43:19

If you're if you feel you're exchanging information, or you're not sure but similar to the meaningful use program.

[DeeAnne McCallin] 11:43:26

Years, where an initial requirement to even apply to the meaningful user and earn incentive dollars was that you use what was called certified Electronic Health Record Technology.

[DeeAnne McCallin] 11:43:43

So that was the first step you'd similar to now, you need to assign the Dsa back.

[DeeAnne McCallin] 11:43:47

Then in meaningful use. Years, if you were in eligible professional type or hospital, you needed to be using a certified electronic health record technology, even though you might have purchased that.

[DeeAnne McCallin] 11:44:00

Or you might be a licensed user of an Ehr that did not buy like did not guarantee that you were a meaningful user.

[DeeAnne McCallin] 11:44:09

So the same thing happens that you might be exchanging today under a national network, you might be exchanging with an Hio today or a qhio in September.

[DeeAnne McCallin] 11:44:21

You might be a client or customer that does not completely mean that you are compliant, or meeting the terms of the data exchange framework.

[DeeAnne McCallin] 11:44:31

So just because you have certified use of certified electronic health record technology back in the day did not de facto mean you were a meaningful user?

[DeeAnne McCallin] 11:44:42

You needed to actually use that. So this is the functionality of the capability, good demonstration of an organization that is shown financial strength and technical.

[DeeAnne McCallin] 11:44:55

Ability to be able to be compliant, but you still need to be able to make sure you're exchanging.

[DeeAnne McCallin] 11:45:03

So maybe you are already working with an Hio today. But you don't actually exchange.

[DeeAnne McCallin] 11:45:08

You still need workflow, or you still need that lance interface the build that that connect that last mile to really get to more better exchange than what you might have functionality for today.

[DeeAnne McCallin] 11:45:23

But you've never fully implemented. So that's some of what we're looking for in these applications.

[DeeAnne McCallin] 11:45:35

There is a contract date requirement within the Qhio program.

[DeeAnne McCallin] 11:45:41

If you contracted with an hio prior to, I think the date is January first, 2023, then that's where you would not be eligible, and we would steer you towards the technical assistance.

Grant, if you still need functionality and support for actual implementation of exchange.

[DeeAnne McCallin] 11:46:10

Alright! We don't see any hands raised. We've done a fair job of answering the questions today for the best of our abilities.
