		8. Requirement QHIOs must receive, process, and forward Admit, Discharge, Transfer (ADT) event notifications from acute care facilities and emergency departments. These ADT capabilities will be introduced over time and gradually expand to include more events and broader notification. In order to achieve qualification in 2023, an applicant must commit to a series of future developments. Section e Securely share the digital identities of the individuals on their ADT rosters with other QHIOs so that these other QHIOs can also monitor for events on these individuals. If an event is found for an indi
