Vision for Data Exchange in California



The Vision for Data Exchange in California

Once implemented across California, the Data Exchange Framework (DxF) will create new connections and efficiencies between health and social services providers, improving whole-person care.

The DxF is California's first-ever statewide Data Sharing Agreement (DSA) that requires the secure and appropriate exchange of health and human services information to enable providers to work together and improve an individual's health and wellbeing.






The Role of the Qualified HIO (QHIO)

The DxF is a single data sharing agreement and common set of policies and procedures that govern and require the exchange of health and social services information (HSSI).

To participate in the DxF, signatories must be able to send and receive HSSI, locate a patient record based on person attributes, format HSSI to conform with DxF standards, meet privacy and security requirements, and more.

For many signatories, these are not current capabilities, and they may choose to seek the services of a QHIO to help manage the exchange.

Signatories are not required to use a QHIO — however, a QHIO is a vetted source that can assist a Participant to meet the requirements of the DSA.






QHIO Application and Guide




QHIO Application and Guide Overview

CDII released the QHIO Application and its accompanying guide on August 28, 2023



QHIO Application Guide: Contains details on application preparation, submission, review, and appeals processes.



QHIO Application: Contains three sections with attestations that must be completed by QHIO applicants.

QHIO Applications are due by 5:00pm PT on September 21, 2023.





QHIO Application Structure

The QHIO Application is organized into three sections

- A. Organization Information
- B. Privacy and Security
- C. Functional Capabilities







Preparing the Application: Key Instructions


- Each of the application's three sections contain a series of requirements followed by a statement where the applicant must attest that their organization meets the requirement.
 - Failure to attest or misrepresenting the applicant's capabilities may be cause for failure to receive or subsequent removal of "qualified" status.
- Following the naming conventions, file formats, and other instructions found in the "Preparing an Application" section of the QHIO Application Guide will help speed an accurate assessment of your application.

Application Assessment

- Complete applications will move into assessment
- The applicant's primary contact will be contacted if any questions arise during the assessment
- If an applicant does not qualify, the reasons for not qualifying will be shared
- Applicants who are informed they did not qualify may wish to appeal the determination (refer to the next slide for appeals)



Appeals Process

An appeals process will be available to applicants who do not qualify

CDII Notification to Applicant

Applicants that do not qualify will receive an explanation of which response(s) were unsatisfactory and why.



To initiate an appeal, the applicant must notify CDII via email of its intent to appeal within three business days of notification.

Appeal Determination

If the appeal is successful, the applicant will be "qualified" and included in QHIO announcements. If the appeal is not successful, the applicant may reapply in a future application round.

Appeal Form Submission

The applicant must then submit a "QHIO Application Determination Appeal Form" within ten business days of notification of CDII's determination





Communicating Results



Communicating Results

- Applicants that CDII deems as qualified will be notified by CDII
- Following this notification, CDII will publicly announce the names of the applicants that were qualified



- CDII will lead all QHIOs in QHIO program development to support DxF operations
- CDII expects to announce QHIOs in October 2023
