# Vision for Data Exchange in California



# The Vision for Data Exchange in California

Once implemented across California, the Data Exchange Framework (DxF) will create new connections and efficiencies between health and social services providers, improving whole-person care.

The DxF is California's first-ever statewide Data Sharing Agreement (DSA) that requires the secure and appropriate exchange of health and human services information to enable providers to work together and improve an individual's health and wellbeing.



# Who Must Sign the DSA?

#	Required Signatory Type*
1	General acute care hospitals, as defined by Health and Safety Code (HSC) section 1250.
2	Physician organizations and medical groups.
3	Skilled nursing facilities, as defined by HSC section 1250, that currently maintain electronic records.
4	Health care service plans and disability insurers that provide hospital, medical, or surgical coverage that are regulated by the Department of Managed Health Care or the Department of Insurance. This section shall also apply to a <u>Medi-Cal managed care plan under a comprehensive risk contract</u> with the Department of Health Care Services pursuant to Chapter 7 (commencing with Section 14000) or Chapter 8 (commencing with Section 14200) of Part 3 of Division 9 of the Welfare and Institutions Code that is not regulated by the Department of Managed Health Care or the Department of Insurance.
5	Clinical laboratories, as that term is used in Section 1265 of the Business and Professions Code, and that are regulated by the Department of Public Health.
6	Acute psychiatric hospitals, as defined by HSC section 1250.

\*Organizations were required to sign by January 31, 2023, regardless of whether they must begin sharing data by January 31, 2024, or January 31, 2026.

# Mandatory Signatories Should Sign the DSA Immediately

**Mandatory signatories were required to execute the DSA by January 31, 2023. We encourage those who have not yet signed the DSA to do so as soon as possible.**

# DxF this Month

Since our last *Information is Power* webinar on August 24, 2023, CDII and stakeholders have continued to advance DxF implementation across several domains.



## Governance

The next Implementation Advisory Committee (IAC) meeting will be held on November 16, 2023. The meeting will include updates on DSA Signatory Grants, the QHIO Program, and P&Ps under development.



## DSA P&P Development

- CDII released a Notice of Intended Administrative Changes to the Individual Access Services P&P. More information on the proposed changes is available on the DxF website.
- The next meeting of the DSA P&P Subcommittee is on October 31, 2023.



## DxF Grants

- Round 2 DSA Signatory Grant awardees have been announced!
- Round 3 to apply for a DSA Signatory Grant is open! If you have signed the DSA and can demonstrate a health information technology need, you are eligible to apply.



## QHIO

The 2023 QHIO Application window closed on September 21, 2023. CDII is currently reviewing applications.

# Grant Application Rounds: Round 3 Opens October 16, 2023

Up to \$47 million in funding will be allocated to applicants across at least three rounds of funding.

CDII is holding multiple rounds to help achieve the 2024 deadline for some organizations to begin exchanging data while ensuring that organizations with limited resources have sufficient time to complete and submit a grant application.

# I signed the Data Sharing Agreement...now what?

## Apply for DSA Signatory Grants

- DxF DSA Signatories that require additional support and capabilities to meet their DSA requirements are eligible to apply for a [DSA Signatory Grant to help offset costs of relevant Technical Assistance or QHIO Onboarding investments](#).

## Resource – DxF Educational Grantees

- CDII is working with DxF Educational Grantees to support signatories in meeting DxF DSA requirements.
- Organizations should reach out to one of CDII's DxF Education Grantees (see next slide) to learn more about the DxF.

## Prepare to Meet Data Exchange Expectations

- Broaden your knowledge of the DxF by reading the [DSA and its P&Ps](#).
- Understand what information you have to exchange and when you have to start exchanging
- Ensure you have the technical capabilities needed to exchange (e.g., by assessing current technology capacity and determining whether you need to upgrade or onboard new technology to meet DxF requirements).

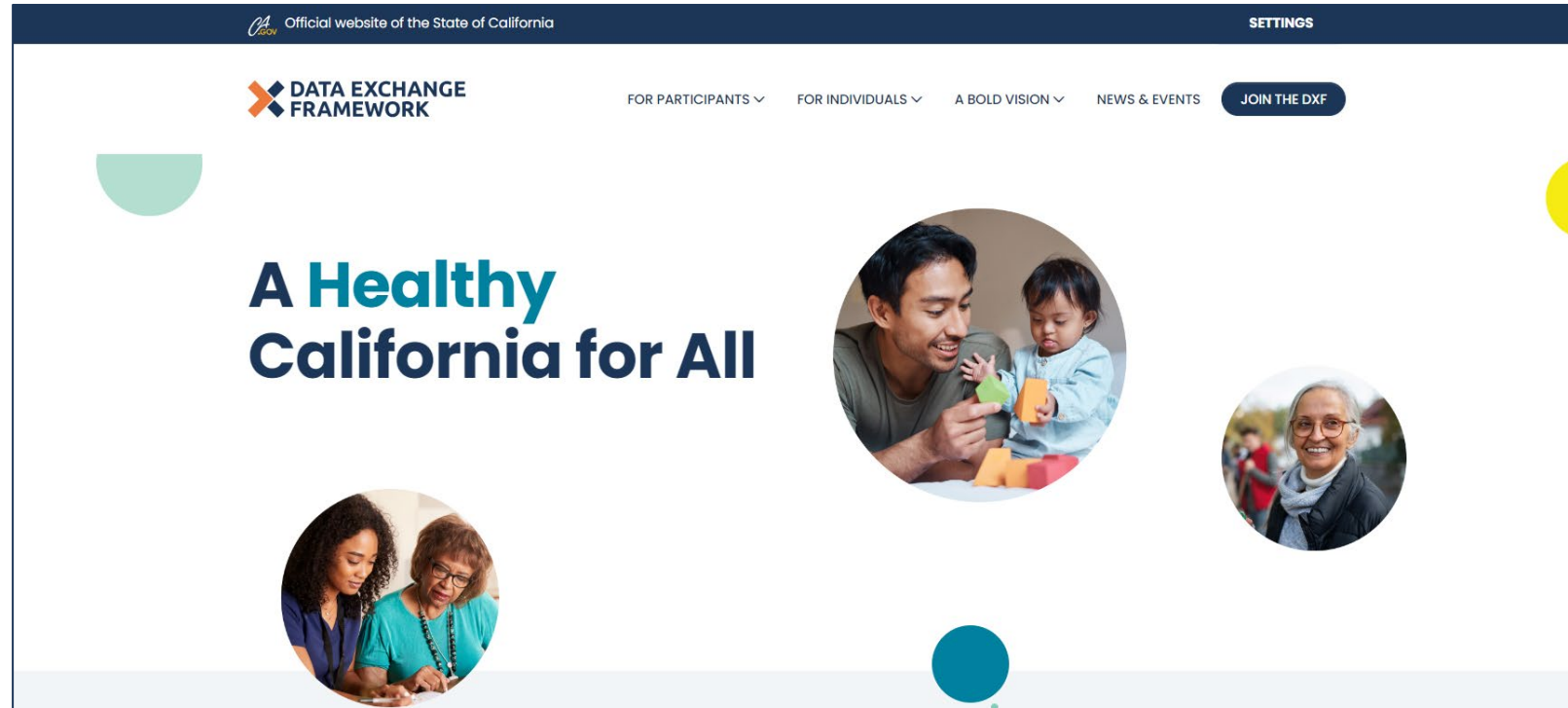

# DSA Signatory Grant Updates: Round 3



# About DSA Signatory Grants

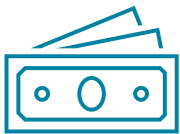
As part of the DxF Grant Program, CDII is administering **DSA Signatory Grants** that provide direct support to Signatories of the Data Sharing Agreement to subsidize their implementation efforts.



**Purpose:** DSA Signatory Grant funds can be used to implement a range of activities needed to achieve real-time data exchange in accordance with the DxF.



**Eligibility:** Organizations who have **signed the DSA** and demonstrate a DxF technology need are eligible for a DSA Signatory Grant.



**Funding Amount:** Applicants may request between \$15,000 and \$100,000 – dependent on organizational characteristics -- per electronic record instance.

# Two Options for Applicants

There are two pathways for organizations interested in a DSA Signatory Grant:



## Qualified Health Information Organization (QHIO) Onboarding Grants

The “**assisted**” pathway for organizations seeking to onboard to a QHIO.

Applications are submitted by **CAHIE** on the Applicant’s behalf.

The Grantee’s contracted **QHIO** receives and manages grant funds.



## Technical Assistance (TA) Grants

The “**build your own**” pathway for organizations seeking pursue a range of activities needed to conduct real-time data exchange in accordance with the DxF.

Applications are submitted by the **Applicant**.

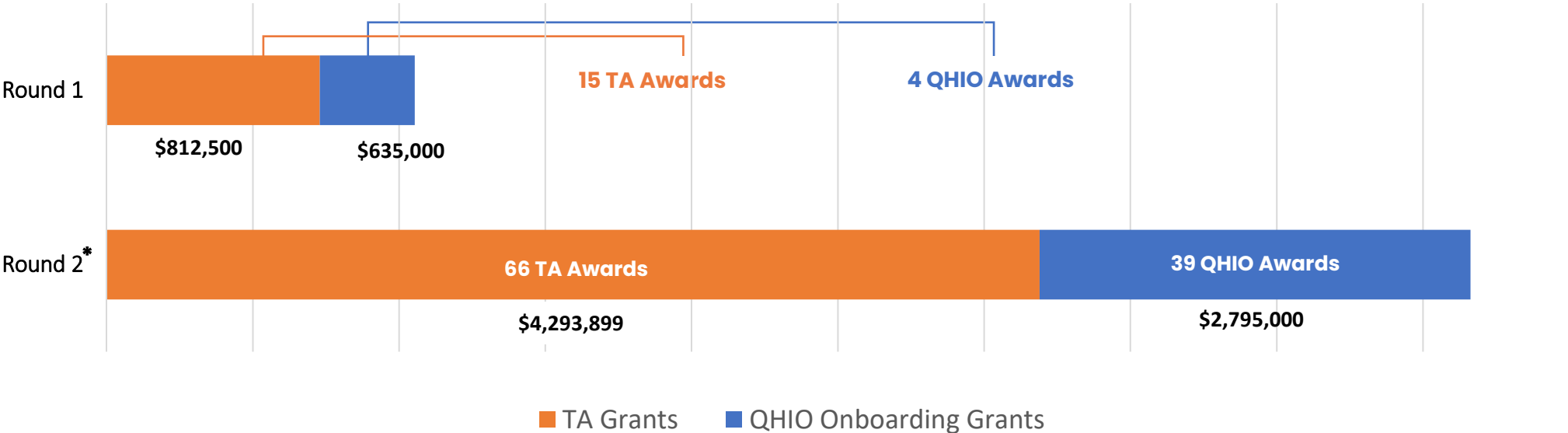
The **Grantee** receives and manages the funds directly.

Eligible organizations may apply for one of these two grant domains.

# DSA Signatory Grants: Round 1 & 2 Awardees

To date, CDII has awarded **\$8.6 million** in grants to **120+ Signatories**.

**\*Additional grants may be awarded in Round 2.**

# Round 3 Is Now Open

Round 3 is now open for all required and voluntary signatories.



## Round 3 Opens October 16

- Round 3 will be open for at least two months.
- CDII will notify the public of the total grants awarded in each round and provide at least 30 days of notice before the last round of Applications closes.

Even though the Organization has signed the DSA under the FQHC Consortium, they should get their CEO to attest on their grant application form.

# Umbrella Applications Are Encouraged Where Appropriate

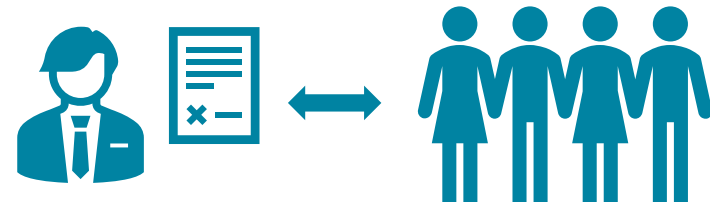
Eligible Signatories may choose **to apply on their own, or** as part of an **“umbrella” application with other Signatories.**

An **Applicant** is the organization that submits the Application for a DSA Signatory Grant. They can be:



An eligible Signatory applying on their own behalf.

*Examples include a solo physician practice, a single county, or an individual safety net hospital.*



An organization applying on behalf of one or multiple eligible Signatories.

- *Examples include a corporate parent, an Independent Practice Association, others.*
- *All DSA Signatories included in an Application must co-sign the Application.*

# DSA and P&P Impact

The DSA and its P&Ps define the who, what, when, why and how of data exchange

- Who** → **DSA** signatories participate in data exchange
- What** → **Data Elements to Be Exchanged** defines the data to be shared
- When** → **Real-Time Exchange** defines the timeliness of exchange
- Why** → **Permitted, Required and Prohibited Purposes** defines reasons for exchange where participants must participate
- How** → **Technical Requirements for Exchange** defines the types of data exchange participants must support
- How** → **Privacy Standards and Security Safeguards** defines the protections that are applied during exchange

*Follow Up on Lisa and Dr. Tom*

# More from Lisa and Dr. Tom



- In July, Lisa experienced an acute care event where Dr. Tom, her primary care physician, was able to stay informed throughout Lisa's admission. He followed up with Lisa shortly after discharge and these care transitions were well supported by DxF data exchange.



- At Lisa's recent visit to Dr. Tom's office, Dr. Tom noticed Lisa seemed a little short of breath and her weight had increased.
- Dr. Tom asked Lisa about her daily routine including diet, medication and exercise.
- Lisa reported no changes.

## How the DSA and P&Ps Relate

Signing the DSA established Dr. Tom's practice as a participant in the Data Exchange Framework

Dr. Tom's practice uses a Qualified Health Information Organization (QHIO) – established by the QHIO P&P – to help with data exchange.

NOTE: Dr. Tom's practice can also work with another intermediary or use their own technologies for data exchange.

# Getting Back on Track



- Dr. Tom remained concerned and decided to query the health plan that manages Lisa's pharmacy benefits to gain insight into whether she has been regularly filling her prescriptions.
- Leveraging the services of his QHIO, Dr. Tom sent a query and received a response indicating that the plan has not received any recent claims for prescription refills.
- Dr. Tom returned to his conversation with Lisa and she acknowledged that it has been difficult to keep up with the co-payments for this medication and so she was only taking half the recommended dose each day.
- Dr. Tom reviewed the options and moved Lisa to more affordable medication.

By signing the **DSA**, the health plan joins Dr. Tom and the QHIO as DxF Participants.

**Required, Permitted and Prohibited Purposes P&P** establishes treatment as a required purpose for exchange.

**Technical Requirements for Exchange P&P** defines the standards used to match digital identities and send/respond to requests.

**Requirement to Exchange P&P** establishes the requirement to respond.

**Real-Time P&P** defines the timeliness of response.

**Privacy Standards and Security Safeguards P&P** protects the data throughout the exchange.

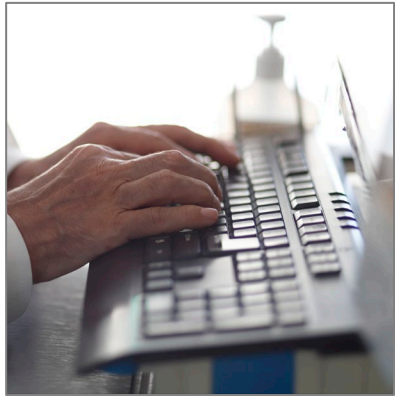
# Right Care, Right Place, Right Time



- Emily works in the utilization management department of a California health plan.
- Her team's job is to help their members receive the right care, in the right place, and at the right time.
- This isn't always easy, but Emily and her team have found that California's Data Exchange Framework can support their efforts.
- Working closely with her analytics team, Emily identified a cohort of members with chronic health conditions who frequently turn to emergency services to manage their needs.
- The health plan believes that with more information and better care coordination, these members can often be more effectively managed in the primary care setting.



# Monitoring for Acute Care Events



- While Emily continues her focus on educating members, her team also shared the member cohort with a DxF QHIO so that they can learn about acute care events when they occur, making their interventions more timely and thus more effective.
- A member of Emily's team is alerted when an admission occurs for one of these members.
- Upon receipt of an event, this utilization manager can begin to work with the member's providers to consider the most appropriate care setting.



Signing the DSA establishes the health plan as a DxF participant.

The health plan uses a Qualified Health Information Organization (QHIO) – established by the QHIO P&P – to help with data exchange.

**Required, Permitted and Prohibited Purposes P&P** establishes certain healthcare operations as a required purpose for exchange.

**Technical Requirements for Exchange P&P** defines the standards used to match digital identities and send events.

**Real-Time P&P** defines the timeliness of response.

**Privacy Standards and Security Safeguards P&P** protects the data throughout the exchange.



# Right Care, Right Place, Right Time



- In addition to working with providers, Emily and her team also use the acute care event as a learning opportunity for the member, helping them understand their care options.
- And, with a better understanding of its high-risk members and their care choices, the health plan can refine its educational tools, messages and interventions.
