Count	Name	Comment	Response(s)¹
1	Leigh Burchell	How do you see this intersecting with TEFCA, given that that is supposed to become more of a reality in only a few months and could address much of what you're talking about?	TEFCA is a voluntary network with limited use cases at the start - unclear how robust it will be. Being a signatory to the state DxP is required for a number of different types of health and social service organizations, and the use cases for exchange are broader. Thus, can't just punt to or depend on TEFCA to address the needs. But we've been trying to align what we're doing here with federal policies.
2	Leigh Burchell	USCDI v2 was published but is not yet required of certified EHR technology.	True. This was discussed.
3	Zach Gillen (KP)	For IHE Query/Response (XCPD/XCA) and the associated CCDAs that are generated by EHRs typically support a document producing USCDI v1

However, HL7 v2.x is a different animal and there are many legacy interfaces that could have been implemented for specific purposes and use cases that might not follow exactly the USCDI standard. Why is this being mandated for legacy connections? This could require a significant lift for organizations to retrofit that might ultimately have little benefit.
