That requires the secure and appropriate exchange of health and human service information to enable providers to work together and improve individuals.

Our discuss our QHIO program. And some updates and some go forwards. I discuss opportunities to apply for ensuring agreement signatory grants that are underway.

We're tracking at about a rough number is about 30% there in terms of where our goal is to get a hundred percent there in terms of where our goal is to get 100% of required signers.

As a reminder, the QHIO policy and procedure, which was finalized a few months ago, states that CDI shall establish, manage and oversee a qualified HIO program that among other things, set fourth the requirements for participant that is an intermediary to be designated as a qualified HIO and any ongoing obligations that have qualified HIO must meet in order to

retain such designation. Thank you. So these organizations have also joined and raised their hand to become a qualified HIO knowing that there's upcoming and ongoing development of obligations.

So, Go to you for trusting us and coming on board while we're still creating these and those are the parameters that we lean upon that we're in the finalized PNP that is published on our web page.

Let's go into the next slide. And as a result, we're working on, program guide.

So the program guidance, it'll be similar yet different to the DSAs to the grants program program guidance that we have.

And we're envisioning different sections or chapters for this. So. We're working with you, the IAC, and the QH IOs to identify QHIO obligations and detail those in program guidance.

We expect to develop guidance as detailed in this table, such as the QH I/O. Program overview.

A section on the roles and responsibilities of the QHIO. So this is where any stakeholder would be able to go and look to see what is the responsibility of the QHIO.

QHIO communications guidelines section, which is which provides guidelines to the QH IOs for consistent communications regarding the data exchange framework.

And any of you should be, hopefully you're all probably using the QHIO seal. It's different.

We have participants who have signed the DSA can use a participant, while go with seal. Our contracted partners use a license logo essentially that's under their contract terms to as as partners, contracted partners and then QHIOs have their own QHIO CLs.

So each QH I/O technically can use 2 seals because they are QHIO and they are a participant.

They have signed the data sharing agreement. Qhio grant requirements. So that's been, that's a main domain of our grants program, QHIO onboarding, where they become the signatories partner.

Who actually does the progress reporting in the milestone reporting on behalf of the grant recipients of QH.

I/O onboarding, but they can only do that with the grantee, the signatories, signature on those milestones and progress reports.

So it's a collaborative effort there, but that will be a section of the program guide even though a lot of that is already drafted in the grants guidance document.

The QHIO, the QHIO data sharing, that's a section that describes, that we envision will describe how QHIO share data with other QHIOs.

Participant directory section. So if any of you were tuned in on October 30 first at the subcommittee meeting there was a long discussion on participant directory that we're developing and the QHIOs may have a role in that.

So that's, another section we anticipate. A data exchange framework reporting requirements. So this would be the type of thing that the QHIOs have said yes we will report.

Whatever you might be asking so that you know a little bit of blind faith there, but that's what we will be developing in putting it to pen to paper so that everybody knows what these requirements are.

But there might be an attestation section which will set the timelines and processes for future QHIO applications.

And then a complaint process, the QHIO should help us establish and develop a complaint process for people who are trying to exchange under the framework and I envision that as a group of 9 entities that we expect a lot of participants on into the framework to utilize the services of a QHIO so that we can work with.

We can tailor and work on a complaints program that way. That also will be able to go to scale for anybody under the framework.

Yeah. As best we can as much as as CDI has the authority to lay that out and do it.

We do and have in our work plans and everything that these are the last 2 new we know stakeholders have been asking when are you gonna stop creating new PNPs before implementation so these 2 are coming in these should be the last 2.

So for the participant directory is the purpose of this. P and P is to communicate. Participants choices in the networks, HIOs or technologies that they will use to provide access to and exchange of help and social service information under the data exchange framework.

It's it's a directory. It's your your choice of how you choose it's not technical endpoint or you know like the keys to your system's information it's it's naming what and I'll have drop downs and it's currently scope to.

And lay on top of our data. Sharing agreement signing portal. And then we have a fees P and P both of these are going to be released soon for public comment and this PMP contains language that requires more specificity, hard work for me, and consistency regarding participants charging fees for data exchange.

So this VPNP will consolidate the requirements associated with charging fees for data exchange under the framework that are currently found across PNPs, and bringing it into one PNP.

So. When we have a finalized new BSP, we will then go to make administrative changes to remove any fees verbiage in these 3 PNPs of California information blocking prohibitions permitted required and prohibited purposes PPP and the individual access services.

Sure. So, I can add a little bit of information to that. We reviewed draft language for that PNP at the last DSA and PNP subcommittee.

Meetings, you can take a look at the draft language there, but the requirement is for participants to list their choices at the intermediaries or technologies that they're going to be using to meet their obligations.

That is what will be in the PNP posted for public comment in the next few days. It is not a requirement for anyone including technology vendors to list detailed technical information, especially that might present a security risk in that directory.

So it is about choices that participants are making. The network. HIO, QHIO, other intermediary or their own technology that they're using to meet their applications.

What is more likely is I'm a hospital and I am using e health exchange as the process to send me requests for information or I am using a particular QHIO.

As my process for receiving. Requests for information, information delivery, or request for notifications of admissions and discharges.

That's what the current PNP would suggest. that all participants would be required to put in such choices.

And so they would They would only list their own technology if they're expecting point to point connections. For all of that information.

Right. So if they were using MEDICATION, they would list that in addition to health exchange for other exchange patterns.

Right. It there is an assumption in the participant directory that you may have different choices depending upon the type of information to be exchanged.

And so those choices. For different types of exchange can be different to meet the needs of individual participants or they can all be the same solution.

Thank you. And then the second question regarding the fees. You're talking about, again, participants.

So hospitals, health plans, etc. Are you trying to just consolidate the information around, you know, how you would charge an individual like you do today where If, if I want my medical record, there's a certain limit regulatory requirement to provide it at a certain cost, 10 cents per page, that kind of thing.

Is that what this policies looking towards?

Again, yes, that is essentially what this policy is trying to do. It's both for required and permitted purposes and for individual access.

And to try to potentially distinguish different types of intermediaries because there may be different allowances for fees to be charged.

By certain types of participants like intermediaries. Versus other types of participants. For example, if an intermediary is facilitating participants exchange capabilities like a QHIO, we shouldn't prohibit QHIO for charging its customers fees.

We're trying to articulate that in one place in a new fees, policy procedure and pulling. The components of fees that exist in the 3, B, 3, B, and B, that was to have the slide into one single.
