



# California Health & Human Services Agency Center for Data Insights and Innovation (CDII) Joint Data Exchange Framework (DxF) Implementation Advisory Committee (IAC) and Data Sharing Agreement Policies & Procedures (DSA P&P) Subcommittee Meeting

# **Meeting Summary**

May 15, 2025, 9:00 a.m. to 11:30 a.m.

#### **Attendance**

# **Meeting Notes**

#### Welcome

John Ohanian, CalHHS Chief Data Officer and Director of CDII, welcomed attendees to the joint meeting.

#### **DxF Summit Reflections**

John and Aparna Ramesh, Chief, Research and Data Insights Branch, CDSS, reflected on the 2025 DxF Summit, "The Road to Whole-Person Care", which brought together 236 health and social services leaders, community-based organizations, and technology experts. John also reflected on the recent DxF Roadshow events.

#### **2025 Technical Standards Updates Advancement**

Dr. Rim Cothren, Independent Consultant, CDII, reviewed the Technical Standards Advancement process and the 2024 Standards Committee recommendations for advancement. Rim discussed potential topics for the 2025 committee and invited feedback on whether to pursue advancements for 2026 or 2027 implementation. Member comments included:





- Several members recommended waiting on further federal updates before considering advancements for 2026 and 2027.
- One member flagged the recent <u>request for information</u> (RFI) from the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) and Assistant Secretary for Technology Policy (ASTP) and recommended that CDII wait for additional details before advancing technical standards.
  - o Response: CDII will consider whether to respond to the federal RFI.
- One member noted that certain social services data are missing from the United Stated Core Data for Interoperability (USCDI) version 3.
  - Note: Another member noted that ASTP/ONC accepts public comments on the Standards Version Advancement Process (SVAP).

## **DxF Participant Directory**

Jacob Parkinson, DxF Deputy Director, CDII, provided an overview of the DxF Participant Directory. Jacob invited feedback on how organizations use the Participant Directory and how the resource could be improved.

#### Member comments included:

- One member noted that the Participant Directory is most useful for sending ADT event notifications.
- Several members provided recommendations for improving the Participant Directory, which included:
  - Allow Participants to specify their exchange purposes (e.g., treatment, payment, healthcare operations, social services data, etc.)
  - o Indicate which listed Participants are compliant with DxF requirements.
  - List contact information and data exchange preferences for each Participant.
  - Integrate with national directories to prevent redundant listings and avoid recreating efforts at the state level.
  - Provide an Application Programming Interface (API) endpoint to enable live access to directory data.

### **Consent Management Architecture**

Elison Alcovendaz, Assistant Deputy Director, Health Information Management Division, DHCS, described the Authorization to Share Confidential Medi-Cal Information (ASCMI) initiative, ASCMI form outline, and proposed use cases. Elison outlined DHCS' proposed Consent Management Platform (CMP), workflow for documenting consent, and discussions with Technical Advisory Subcommittee (TASC) focus groups.

#### Member comments included:

- One member asked whether the CMP will be limited to Medi-Cal members.
  - Response: CMP will follow a phased approach, beginning with Medi-Cal and Behavioral Health Transformation (BHT) populations before scaling beyond.
- One member asked whether DHCS has documented care partner workflow.





- Response: DHCS has not yet fully documented a care partner workflow but is in the process of doing that and will be seeking stakeholder input to inform and support needed workflow changes.
- One member asked whether DHCS will use the same vendor for consent and identity management services.
  - o Response: DHCS has not yet determined this.
- One member flagged the release of a <u>Sequoia Project white paper</u> on privacy and consent.
- One member highlighted the importance of developing a payer agnostic CMP, citing that behavioral health clients often experience changes in coverage.
- Several members raised questions about whether the CMP will serve as a source of truth for consent, managing identity, and handling historical consent data
- One member acknowledged the need for clear rules and metadata to track consent origins and changes.
- One member also raised concerns about building a California-specific solution that may not align with national, rules-based models, highlighting the importance of designing for interoperability.

# **DxF Advisory Committee Updates**

John provided an overview of the DxF Advisory Committee changes for 2025, including an announcement that the DSA P&P Subcommittee will be sunset, and replaced with the Privacy, Operations, Policy, and Security (POPS) Committee

## **DxF Implementation Updates**

Jacob provided a brief update on DxF Advisory Committees, DSA P&P development, DxF Grants, and the QHIO program. Jacob also announced that CDII will be conducting a Participant Survey in May.

#### **Public Comment**

John opened the meeting to public comment. Public comments included:

- A question about whether QHIO audit results will be made publicly available.
  - Response: CDII has not yet determined the strategy for releasing QHIO audit results.
- A suggestion for CDII to consider the DirectTrust messaging framework, which supports human-readable content and may support organizations with limited technical capacity.

#### **Next Steps and Closing Remarks**

John reviewed the next steps to close the meeting.
