Once implemented across California, the Data Exchange Framework (DxF) will create new connections and efficiencies between health and social services providers, improving whole-person care.



Consent Management TAC Series Objective

The objective of this meeting series is to develop recommendations for coordinating collection, sharing, and use of an individual's consent, ensuring it is applied consistently when exchanging HSSI under the DxF.



What We Heard Last Meeting

- Consent processes must be patient-centered and accessible, especially for individuals with limited digital access or literacy, including those experiencing homelessness.
- A distributed consent model may be preferred, supported by a standardized data model that can be adopted across platforms and systems.
- Consent forms should use plain language—ideally below standard literacy levels—to ensure clarity and usability for all users.
- Consent management systems must support reconciliation of multiple versions, with the most recent consent treated as authoritative.
- Adolescents and foster youth require tailored consent frameworks that reflect their unique legal and privacy needs.
- A Slack channel should be created to continue technical and policy discussions between meetings and support ongoing collaboration.

Questions for Today What is the Model for Consent?

- 1. What are the components for a logical model for consent for exchange of different types of information?
 - a. For example, where it was collected, when it was collected, what types of data it governs, who it was collected from (individual or legal guardian), etc.
- 2. How do you reconcile consent collected in different places and for different purposes?
 - a. Can reconciliation be automated and operationalized?
- 3. How do you establish trust so that a Participant will act on consent obtained by another Participant?
